Archbishop's Dream for Our Parish



Archbishop Bernard Hebda has a dream for our parish and every parish in this Archdiocese: a dream in which all Catholics are in a small group. He dreams such things because being in small groups can help our faith come more fully to life and help us draw closer to Jesus. In the earliest days of the Church, small groups spread the good news of Jesus – and they can do it again today.

Our Synod Evangelization Team (SET) has been preparing to help make the Archbishop's dream of Catholics in small groups a reality: creating a small group ministry here at Saint Bonaventure. If you feel inspired by this or any other

aspect of the Archdiocesan Synod process, consider the following action steps:

- Read the Pastoral Letter, "You Will Be My Witnesses," online at archspm.org/synodletter (also available via podcast).
- Prayerfully discern participating in Small Group Leader Formation, a FREE seven-week series held in the fall right here at our parish, facilitated virtually by Bishop Joseph Williams. This formation is intended for those who are open to the possibility of playing a leadership role in a small group.

Eucharistic Miracles Exhibition: July 15-16



Teenager Carlo Acutis created a website: miracolieucaristici.org, documenting Eucharistic miracles worldwide until his death at 15. A photographic exhibit of his work now travels the world and was in our Gathering Space, July 15-16.

The exhibit's beautiful panels document each Eucharistic Miracle with photos, illustrations, and background information on where they took place, witnesses to the miracle, and the lasting influence of the miracles on the people and places they occurred.



Eucharistic miracles are extraordinary events where the Eucharist no longer appears under the form of bread and wine but takes on the biological qualities of human flesh or blood or both. One scientifically verified and church-proven case of this is the bread turning into flesh.

"To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan," Acutis stated. Blessed Carlo Acutis was beatified in 2020; his feast day is October 12, and he is a patron for computer programmers and youth.

Our Lady of the Angels Adoration Chapel

Angelus Prayer in Adoration Chapel Daily at Noon

The Angelus prayer is being prayed aloud in our Adoration Chapel every day at noon. Our prayer time begins with the ringing of a bell because our parish patron, St Bonaventure, recommend that prayers at noon begin with a bell ringing to gather the faithful. This short prayer is prayed daily by Christians around the world, especially at noon, and recalls the incarnation of Christ among us. All are welcome to join; prayer cards with text in English and Spanish are provided.

What's Happening



Our Building and Grounds Committee and volunteers constantly work to maintain and make improvements to our campus. Beyond special projects, they keep our 12 acres of land looking beautiful through a lot of ongoing maintenance and efforts.

Activities Building Kitchen and Storage Updates: We are looking into updating some parts of our Activities Building Kitchen. We have made some necessary repairs and upgrades to the sinks and below them, but more will come!

We completed the last wall closet projects this summer. The new closets in Rooms 7 & 8 will provide more long-term storage to free up room in the chair room and provide storage needs for other ministries.

No More Ash Trees—More Variety of Trees on Property: Our tree project is nearing completion. The remaining ten ash trees were cut down in the spring. That's right; they are almost all gone [about 50], 13 new trees were planted to replace those ash trees, along with transplanting others to the right location. The new trees are a variety to add to the beauty of our property. Most of the new ones are on the Chicago side of our property, with some on 10th Ave. and others in various places.

Holes are Gone and Fresh White Lines: In May, we filled the holes in our parking lot with fresh blacktop and restriped all our parking spaces, including the office area and the north and south parking lots. We made a few changes for easy parking, including a special location for our bus, and one more space for handicapped parking near Door 5 (Adoration entrance.) We restripe every 2-3 years based on condition and budget. Enjoy the new stripes, and remember to park between the lines.

Appalachia Christmas Shoe Box Mission Project September 11 - October 16

Thank you to all who have graciously participated in the Appalachia Christmas Shoe Box Mission Project in the past, many of you year after year! We are grateful for your immense generosity, which has touched the lives of many children and families in one of the poorest regions of our country. This mission started in 2013, and more than 10,000 shoeboxes have been sent from the St. Paul and Minneapolis Archdiocese! Last year, Saint Bonaventure generously sent 89 beautifully wrapped shoe boxes and other miscellaneous gifts.

We will begin collecting packed shoeboxes and gifts to be included in shoe boxes the week after the Fall Festival. The Shoe Box Mission Project is a wonderful project for children, families, and people of all ages, so be creative and have fun!

We sincerely appreciate the shoe boxes already packed. Please label which category your gift is for, and we suggest each box include a mixture of necessary items and fun Christmas gifts. Gift donations must be new, as this may be our recipients' only Christmas gift this year.

Please label each shoe box with age group (Infant, 2-4, 5-9, 10-14, 15-18, Adult) and whether it is for a male or female.

Try to include:

- a wow item
- a **personal care** item
- a useful item
- a **fun** item
- Add a **personalized note** and a **religious** item if you'd like. Parishes receiving our gifts are Catholic, so please include rosaries and spiritual gifts such as bibles and books about Jesus, Mary, St. Joseph, and other saints or small pictures and crosses they can hang on their walls.

Other needs that may not fit in a shoe box: Towels, laundry soap, large t-shirts and sweatshirts, blankets and bedding, hunting clothes, coats and shoes for kids, wrapping paper, craft kits, ornaments, all toiletries (please put lotion and shampoo in a ziploc bag to prevent spills).

Gift suggestions: Dolls, balls, stuffed animals, small musical instruments, slinky, play-doh, crayons, colored pencils, coloring books, school supplies, notebooks, paints, barrettes, hair ties, headbands, shoes, socks, underwear, bag, purse, bracelets, some sunglasses, lip balm, mirror, watch, flip-flops, sweatshirt, sweat pants, nightgown or pajamas, puzzles, books, flashlight, deodorant, hat, scarf, mittens, sewing kit, picture frame, playing cards, small blanket, blocks, stickers, kitchen items for cooking and baking, stickers, tennis balls, comb, brush, toothbrush, a washcloth, small cars and trucks, interactive toys (please include extra batteries), hacky sack, nail clipper, small tools, games, cosmetics, wallets, jewelry, slippers, and batteries.

DO NOT include: Canned goods or food items; used or damaged items; or violent items such as toy guns or knives.

It is very helpful if:

- Your boxes are wrapped in Christmas gift wrap
- Liquid toiletries are packed in ziploc bags (to prevent leaking)

If you would rather not pack a shoebox, we can accept items to be included in a shoebox later.

Collection bins wrapped in gift wrap will be in the Gathering Space and the entrance of the Activities Building the week after the Fall Festival.

May the blessings of our Risen Savior bring us FAITH, HOPE, AND LOVE. When our gifts are delivered, we will be celebrating the birth of our baby Jesus, the Savior of the world. Thank you for helping us spread his joy!

Respect Life Ministry

Baby Bottle Boomerang: Our 21st Baby Bottle Boomerang in January and February raised funds to support pregnancy resource centers throughout the Twin Cities, greater Minnesota, and western Wisconsin. This year's donations were sent to Elevate Life, which supports more than 36 pregnancy resource centers. Our community generously raised \$9,298.07, bringing our 21-year cumulative total to \$157,000. Praise God!




40 Days for Life: On March 11, more than 40 pro-life prayer warriors from Saint Bonaventure and Nativity of Mary braved wind chills of -20° to pray outside the Bloomington abortion clinic. They did this along with millions of other pro-life groups throughout the country, praying for an end to abortion over the 40 days.

Pro-life Rosary Ministry: Every Thursday for the last 2 1/2 years, parishioners from Saint Bonaventure have prayed at Whole Women's Health at 9:45 a.m. on Thursday mornings to pray for an end to abortion. They are a witness for the unborn children who's lives are in danger at this clinic located less than 3 mi. from here.



Sidewalk Counseling to save women and their unborn children. Many Respect Life ministry members also volunteer to be sidewalk counselors at Whole Women's Health, located near 82nd St. and 35W in Bloomington. They distribute informational brochures and pray for women entering the clinic. While they sometimes put up with harassment and bad weather conditions, lives have been saved, and women have been witnessed to about the sanctity of human life from conception until natural death.

Mother's Day Flower Sale: We sold African violets, begonias, and mini rose bush plants Mother's Day weekend and the proceeds of \$401 were donated to SouthWest Options for Women to help support life for other children and moms.

World Youth Day

Matthew Sell and Will Herrmann from Saint Bonaventure and Emily Dalsky of Nativity of Mary attended the 2023 World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal August 1-6. World Youth Day is a global event for young people established by Pope John Paul II, and occurs every 2-3 years in various cities. The next World Youth Day will be in Seoul, South Korea in 2027.

Traveling with 18 others from the Diocese of Winona-Rochester, they joined young Catholics from 151 countries. Events included talks from Catholic speakers like Bishop Robert Barron, Jason Evert, and Chris Stefanik, along with multi-language events like Stations of the Cross, Eucharistic Adoration, and music. World Youth Day culminated with Sunday Mass celebrated by Pope Francis and attended by 1.5 million people.



"Sometimes it can feel lonely being a person of faith in my generation," Will said. "But events like these with so many young people on fire for their faith really brings hope. It was incredible having Eucharistic Adoration with Pope Francis and having nearly a million people in silent reverence before Our Lord in the Eucharist."



The pilgrimage that Matthew and Will went on also included a visit to Fatima, where in 1917 the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three children and encouraged praying the rosary. After World Youth Day concluded, the group left Portugal and spent three days in Spain visiting Madrid, Toledo, and Ávila, especially their religious sites.

"While we had the privilege to go, we brought prayers from Saint Bonaventure with us, and we hope the graces we received will be shared among everyone back home."

Farewell Sing-Along


